Library Coordinator's Report - Ramey Hengen on behalf of Ashley Merbach

On behalf of the library, thank you for your support which we know comes in many forms. The puzzle tables inside the library and to the left, have seen regular use, and it is not uncommon for puzzling behaviour to take place. The new children's magazines, which are starting to arrive regularly, are fabulous and library staff have been promoting these periodicals to excited families. We are grateful for the ongoing advocacy and local championing, as well as the generous donations throughout the year.

Some of the highlights of 2025 so far:

We hosted a well-attended and extremely interesting author talk and panel discussion with Stephen Gapps, who chose the Benalla Library to launch his book Uprising which includes references to local history and interviews with Community elders and local educator Hamish.

We secured a "Seed Grant" for Science Week, which helped us to deliver a science week that saw 85 adults and 8 children attend the library across the 3 events that included an interview with an astrochemist, an author talk with an astrophysicist and elder, and the Astronomy Benalla Club.

We have welcomed six work experience students for a week each: one university placement and five high school placements.

We have hosted 11 author talks discussing a variety of genres and events, across a variety of times.

We are excited to announce that in 2026 we will be welcoming a new staff member on a post-school traineeship. I am sure you will welcome Daniella when she starts in January.

Once again, we would like to thank you for your support and we look forward to connecting again in 2026.

President's Report – Geraldine McCorkell

In the 12 months since our last AGM the Friends of the Benalla Library have continued support for the Library. We pay for newspapers, magazines and the water cooler on a monthly basis, this year we have purchased a Tektalk 200 piece foldable puzzle table, Upholstery cleaner for the library furniture, Junior and Teen Magazines; and Adult Literacy Learning `Easy Reader' Readers. In the pipeline are a visit from a Speech Pathologist and some Yoto Players, both these are awaiting confirmation. We hope to support the Library staff in many and varied ways in the coming year. Author visit support is an area we could assist with.

All of this could not happen without the support of the volunteers in the bookshop and the patience of Kay with the roster. The last few months it has been a little difficult to fill the roster and I thank those volunteers who work through the morning until mid-afternoon as the need arises, the foot traffic slows down somewhat once Hides Bakery closes. The bookshop continues to be a popular venue for locals and people travelling through who are repeat visitors. I receive quite a few phone calls from local people downsizing or family members asking us to come and clean out bookshelves, Corrie and myself have become quite expert at loading the back of my car with boxes and bags of treasures from people's shelves.

My grateful thanks to the Committee, Deb our Secretary, Corrie Treasurer extraordinaire who walks a regular path to the Bendigo Bank with our takings, Robyn membership officer, Andi our website manager, Kay the keeper of the roster and Christine, Phyllis, Bev and Heather all of whom I know I can call on for a special meeting or assistance.

An extra meeting was called in October with Corrie, Phyllis, Christine and Andi re the website as VicNet are ending their free hosting of community groups in December. Andi researched and found another place that will host our website for free, and with Andi willing to continue managing the website, this has now been set up. I do receive quite a few enquiry calls through the website. At this meeting it was also agreed to provide the volunteers with a

tea/coffee voucher over December and January in appreciation of their efforts, we have done this for quite a few years now.

Our Library continues to thrive, the staff are always helpful and very supportive of our efforts, it has become and will continue to be a community centre, running many and varied programs to support all members of Benalla. It is a pleasure to walk through the door.

The friends of Janet Gourley were saddened by her passing in October following a brief illness. Janet was a Life Member of the Friends and her support was appreciated.

I am confident that the Friends will face the challenges and achievements over the next 12 months and continue support for the Library and the staff with enthusiasm.
